
A Visit to the Sewage Treatment Plant of our region



1. The Comenius team visited a plastic and metal recycling centre in Deva. The students learned about the steps of recycling, from the selective recycling of materials gathered from the households and municipality till the transportation at a regional recycling institute. The workers explained the correct way to recycle plastic or pets and what really recycling means; they also shown us the machines that are used in the recycling process: how these machines compost plastic or metal and transforms them into bales and how these materials are reused.









2. We visited the only photovoltaic park in our region where they learnt about solar panels and how the sunlight reflects through these panels and it generates electricity. The students found out that electricity doesn't necessarily mean hydro- or thermo electricity, but it is possible to have solar energy also.





3. Earth Week in our school.

The first week of April was declared The Earth Week. Every day the students had a lot of activities: cleaning the schoolyard, the park and the forest near the school; they planted flowers and trees in the schoolyard. Thus they learnt about the importance of being a responsible member of the community, they showed the people in Deva that is healthier for the town and the community to gather the trash and to plant trees. This is the only way to have a clean, green and healthy environment.



RELATÓRIO



PRESENTATION

The Portuguese group was formed by two teachers, Mr. Carlos Santos, teacher of ICT, and Mrs. Marina Gomes, teacher of Chemistry and Physics, along with two 11th grade students, Miss Carina Mina of the Science and Technologies course and Miss Cheila Fatia of the Languages and Humanities course.

On the trip to Lithuania, we travelled via Riga, and stayed that first night at a hotel right in the city center, close to the bus station where we would be catching the bus to Siauliai the next day. We have also counted on the help of Latvian teachers during our stay in Riga.

The programme agreed upon for the project's fourth meeting was planned in accordance with the project's general objectives:

- To create behavioural habits and change attitudes towards the protection and preservation of the environment, and to reduce our environmental impact;
- To promote a strategy of "smart" growth;
- To encourage students to get involved in research and innovation;
- To support development without social exclusion more and better employment, particularly to women, children and elders. To try and involve the students from difficult social backgrounds into this project
- To support students in becoming more sensible, informed and responsible active citizens
- To reinforce student's efforts to adopt a healthy lifestyle;
- To improve the quality of education through the transfer and sharing of knowledge and skills with fellow European students;
- To understand and be able to communicate in a foreign language;
- To improve ICT skills;
- To know the language, customs and traditions of different nations
- To feel real European citizens through trans-European projects.

ACTIVITIES

Our group boarded the TAP plane on Lisbon airport, headed to Stockholm, at 9AM, September 27th. 50 minutes after the arrival in Sweden, we boarded a short flight to Riga. We arrived there at 17h25 and where greeted by Jana and Ineta from the Latvian school, wich gave us a ride to the hotel. Jana was kind enough to host Carina at her home for that night. We later had dinner in old Riga, and we were able to visit the Opera house... The next morning we were able to visit old Riga again until the time of the bus to Siauliai. After the arrival a group of Lithuanian teachers greeted us and accompanied us to the hotel.

On Monday morning we were received by the Siauliai mayor and the municipal deputy for education. There was a presentation about the city and the Lithuanian educational system. We the got on the bus to school and arrived there around noon, where were had a guided tour and watched a presentation about the school. After lunch we went on a visit around the town. At the end of the day, all delegations had dinner at the Arkos restaurant, where students and teachers were able to mingle and get to know each other.

On September 30th, we visited the old village of Naisai, with sculptures of pagan gods. Next we went to a stable where we got to know a rare breed of Lithuanian horses. In the afternoon we we visited the Cultural Museum, the Hill of crosses and a water treatment plant. At the end of the day there was a meeting where the project execution so far was evaluated, and the next meetings were planned.

On October 1st we left on na excursion to the Kursiu Nerija National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We participated in some workshops on Witches Hill, got to know rare and protected species (birds, mammals, reptiles) and saw the damage caused by wildfires in that region. We had lunch in the town of Nida, saw the Baltic Sea and the sand dunes next to the border with Russia, wich are protected from all human intervention.

On the next day the International Conference about natural disasters and endangered species was held. There was a workshop where teachers and students built birds using recycled paper, and decorated them with the national flags of each country. After lunch we went to the Kurtuvenai regional park. There we visited a catholic church, an old farm and the Multifunctional Center for Children and Youth. In the evening we had a traditional Lithuanian dinner and each country demonstrated a traditional dance to the others. All

participated in this activity, which was extremely fun. The event ended with all the participants receiving their diplomas and certificates.

On October 3rd, students and teachers went to a class in the Lithuanian school. We then had lunch and after that started our long trip back home. We arrived in Riga at 17h00, and were again greeted by the Latvian teachers. This time it was Ms. Ineta Viksna. After dinner we went to our hotel, and early the next morning boarded the plane to Lisbon, via Vienna.
